This position is made possible in part by a grant from OHA related to providing culturally-specific services, and this position requires specialization in working with gender diverse teens and adults.

All associates will integrate multicultural humility, trauma-informed, and anti-oppression into their work. Supervised hours accrued will fulfill the supervised practice requirements for licensure as a LPC in the

state of Oregon. This is a unique opportunity for motivated individuals to develop their clinical skills in a collaborative, supportive learning environment.
